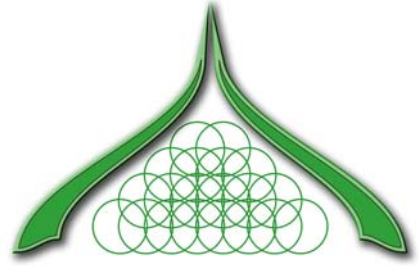


# Christ Fellowship



## SUNDAY SCHOOL GOALS

### GOALS:

**Awareness:** that students will become aware of Biblical truth

**Affirmation:** that students will agree with Biblical truth

**Application:** that students will understand how to respond to Biblical truth

---

*Two's and Three's Class – Susan and Chad Elliott*

**Awareness:** knowing who God is and what God does

**Affirmation:** simple questions asked; simple answers expected, Ex: Who made the sun? God did!

**Application:** thanking God for ALL things (learning to pray)

---

*Four's and Five's Class – Justin and Nikki Lanning*

**Awareness:** that students begin to understand how God works and starts asking “Why?” Take learning to a deeper level than just memorizing - start thinking and connecting stories, patterns and God’s overall plan at work.

**Affirmation:** that the students will give more thoughtful answers to thinking questions asked – answers should include recollection and connection to previous lessons and personal life lessons. Ex: Why did God save Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-Nego? To minister to the mean king. (We encourage answers to discuss to get to the deeper purpose of the story).

**Application:** that the students will be able to communicate the lesson, message, and feelings through multiple modes of communication: verbal, drawing, acting, and actions.

---

*Kindergarten and First Grade – Patti Williams*

**Awareness:** that students will know that God loves and cares for them and He wants their trust and obedience.

**Affirmation:** that students will respond by trusting Jesus as their Savior; they will thank, serve, and praise God.

**Application:** that students will learn about God’s promises in the Bible by studying main Bible characters and memorizing key verses to live by.

---

*Second and Third Grade – Betsy Kinder*

**Awareness:** that students begin to truly understand what God means.

**Affirmation:** that students leave concrete ideas and begin to grasp abstract ones. Ex. What happens when a Christian dies? He “sleeps”, he never dies; he lives eternally.

**Application:** that students have increased excitement for the things of God; hope begins to grow and passion becomes evident.

---

*Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Grades – Beverly Frensley*

**Awareness:** that students know that God has a plan for their lives.

**Affirmation:** that students see that the Bible has Scriptures that specifically show how to walk a Christian walk; also students learn that they are responsible for their choices in life and the consequences (good and bad) for those choices.

**Application:** that students memorize Scripture to have themselves “ready to give an answer”.
