The Sea

The sea is the first of 7 "evils" which will pass away. Sea needs to be understood in its archetypical image. The sea, as such, is not evil. It's imagery represents hostility to mankind, turmoil, disorder, unrest, unprincipled direction. Cf. Isa57.20; Pss107.25-28; Ezek28.8. It's worth nothing that the "sea" stands guard against John on the Isle of Patmos, separating him from the churches!

Sea - Rev21.1; Death - Rev21.4; Mourning - Rev21.4; Weeping - Rev21.4; Pain - Rev21.4; Curse - Rev22.3; Night - Rev21.25; 22.5

God's New Creation with the New Jerusalem will fill to the fullest all the promise made to Israel of God dwelling in their midst (Ex25.8; Ex29.45-46; Lev26.11-13; Ezek37.26-27; Rev21.3).
